
How we Teach



Cultural Programme

Excursions are often to another town or city where students will learn about the history and culture of each location. These trips are typically in a private coach but can sometimes be by train. Students are supervised throughout the trip and are given clear instructions of where to meet and at what time during the day. If you study in London, you might get a day at the seaside in Brighton or a trip to Oxford to see the oldest university in the UK. However, if you study in Brighton you will visit the capital city itself, London, with its fantastic mix of culture, historical buildings and modern architecture.

All of these trips outside of the classroom are carefully managed and organised by GIE's Activity team with students' safety always the priority. Led by the Activity Manager and his/her team of Activity Leaders who make sure everyone is included and maximum enjoyment is had. Our management team are all experienced and trained in safeguarding and first aid. Our Activity Leaders also receive safeguarding and risk assessment training.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

University Campuses

While two University campuses are never the same, we carefully select our summer centres to ensure they offer the high standards that GIE demand and so will allow students to have a great experience they will never forget. We offer a range of locations that will suite every taste; In Brunel University you are less than 60 minutes from central London, whilst at the University of Brighton, you are a short bus ride away from the beach and vibrant town centre.

Our centres all offer modern facilities and as safeguarding is our number one priority, are in safe surroundings. They are all within easy reach of public transport or within walking distance of town centres. Some of the other facilities, such as sports and other options vary but there are many communal areas for students to relax in and a good selection of cafes and shops on campus. All our sites offer Wi-Fi access, so everyone can keep their social media up to date!

Accommodation

Students will stay in either en-suite or standard rooms. All the bedrooms have a bed, wardrobe, desk and chair. Ensuite rooms offer the luxury of a private bathroom. For those who stay in standard accommodation bathroom facilities are shared. The ratios can vary, but on average it is one bathroom for every 3 people. All bedrooms and bathrooms are cleaned weekly, which includes a change of bed linen. Bedrooms are part of a flat, these flats can vary from 4 to 8 individual bedrooms, but all have a kitchen and communal area, which can be a great place to relax at the end of the day. The kitchens are not functional except for the use of fridges. There is always an on-site laundry where students can wash their own clothes, the costs vary but it is approximately £5 per wash and dry.

Classrooms

All the classrooms are equipped with whiteboards (many are interactive or digital nowadays) and are large enough so that students can break out to do group work. All the material is provided for the students and they are each given a folder to keep their work, so that they can continue their studies after the course.

We know how important food is for young people, especially when they are away from home. We always aim to offer a wide variety of food in both residence and homestay accommodation.

- For breakfast, there is a continental breakfast of cereal, bread, fruit and yogurt, along with juices and a selection of hot drinks.
- For lunch and dinner, there is a hot meal, including a vegetarian option, with side dishes. A salad bar is always on offer with fruit, salad vegetables, and either cold meat, cheese or eggs.
- On excursion days, we provide a packed lunch/meal with a filled sandwich, fruit and a drink.

SAFEGUARDING, WELFARE & COVID COMMITMENT

One Commitment

At Greenwich International Education we have students and staff from all over the world and we want all our students to feel comfortable, happy, safe and free from discrimination. The happiness, welfare and progress of every student and member of staff in our summer camp is our top priority. Every student and member of staff should show respect to each other regardless of any differences. We are an international community, and we believe in celebrating any differences we have and learn from each other.

Safeguarding and Welfare

At Greenwich International Education our priority is doing everything we can to make every student's experience the best and safest it can be.

Students can learn English, have fun and boost their confidence, all within the safety of our care.

All our staff are DBS checked and trained in Prevent Duty, welfare and safeguarding as well as how to care for students 24/7.

There is a 24-hour emergency contact phone number, and our staff care about every individual and know that being available to speak to and be listened to is a key part of our commitment to every student.

Safety and security in and outside the camps is very important. We have policies and procedures that we follow to keep everyone safe, including fire safety, first aid and what to do in emergencies. All these policies are available to students and parents. Our Student Handbook and inductions for every student make it clear what every student needs to do to have a safe and fun time while with us. We also do a short test with every student to make sure they understand the rules and know who they can speak to if they have any worries, concerns, problems or feel homesick.

Our camps are for junior students aged 12-17. We occasionally receive requests for students outside of our minimum/maximum age range who wish to come as part of a group. We review each of these special requests individually and undertake a risk assessment to ensure it will not negatively affect the safeguarding and welfare of anyone in our centres. Final decisions will be made by the Designated Safeguarding Lead and the Admissions Team will notify the requesting party of the outcome.

COVID Commitment

Covid has had a dramatic impact on summer camps over the last two years but thanks to the roll-out of Covid vaccinations we all believe that we will have a happy and healthy 2024. We continually assess the Covid situation and regularly update our Covid Risk Assessment. We are guided by the UK Government and Public Health England and abide with their rules and regulations. When we open our centres we will comply to the guidelines at the time and the preparation to run in person courses will include:

Staff training

All our staff will have additional covid training and the Welfare Officer in each centre will also be our Covid Coordinator.

Student Induction

Before students arrive on campus they will be sent an information pack so that they arrive in the UK, in the full knowledge of the latest procedures (which may be different to that of their home country).

Potential Rules

Students and staff can expect any or all of the following procedures in place while in the UK:

- Mask wearing in any indoor environment, from arriving at the airport, travelling to the centre by coach and in the classroom. Exceptions will be in student's bedrooms and in the canteen for meals.
- Regular temperature checks e.g. before meals and activities
- Changes to some parts of the activity programme e.g. no discos and more outdoor options

Confirmed Cases

In the event of a confirmed case there will be a robust procedure of self-isolation for those effected. As all our students are covered by our insurance policy, this includes cover that will pay for additional medical help and flights if the those in self-isolation can't leave the centre on their planned departure date.


- The Cultural Exchange Programme gives students the opportunity to immerse themselves into British culture and lifestyle by living with a local family and attending a traditional British School.
